

Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At St Nicholas CE Primary Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- annual Healthy Mind days – including taster sessions for a variety of sports
- opportunities to compete in: TAG rugby, cricket, orienteering, football, athletics and gymnastic competitions and tournaments
- specialist sports coaching from the local Salisbury area and wider sporting bodies
- training staff to deliver National Curriculum objectives
- A school-wide passion for well-being through sport and fitness, including weekly PE sessions and yoga.
- Involvement in competitive sports such as the Salisbury School's Mini-marathon.
