DSAT Conversion Update:

As you are aware, in recent weeks and months we have been consulting on our plans to join the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust. Thank you to those who attended the meetings or responded to the online questionnaire. At the meeting we were able to present our rationale and discuss the options that had been considered. We were able to follow up a few questions with some of you individually.

As part of the consultation, ourselves and the Trust were able to respond to each of the questions raised and there was nothing to materially affect our decision to make this move. Questions were largely around organisational changes, curriculum and uniform. In each of these cases, you will feel very little difference. The school leadership and staffing structure will remain the same and your day-to-day contact will continue as always. We will be working with the Trust to continually improve and refine our curriculum and education offer in the school as we do now, and we will benefit hugely from their advice and support.

In terms of uniform, there is no need to worry - your children will be able to come to school in their current uniform as normal. Over the year, our uniform providers will be changing the logo to match the new logo we have designed as being part of the Trust. You will be able to continue wearing the current uniform for as long as it is wearable but any new uniform you buy will have the new logo on once current stocks have been run down. Next September, we will be gifting every child with a school sweatshirt with the new logo on.

Currently, the move to the Trust is on schedule to take place on 1st December – we will let you know if there is any change to this. Mr Lacey, the Trust's CEO, will come into school early in the new year to lead a collective worship and to formally welcome the children and staff into the Trust. The day we join DSAT is actually the day of their 10th anniversary. We will be joining them online for a celebration event at 9.30am that morning so the children will quickly feel part of the wider family. As always, if there are questions you have, please do let us know.

On Friday 1st December, we will be holding a Trust-wide 'Bring a Bear, Bring a Pound' day. Each of the schools in DSAT has a Bear (see below) which represents the fact that the school belongs to the Trust, so we are picking up on that theme. Everyone is invited to bring a bear to school and contribute anything up to £1 (less is absolutely fine) which will go towards raising money for the Child of Hope School in Uganda, which is supported by some of our schools. If we all schools in the Trust take part, we could raise over £4,000 for this wonderful cause and make a real difference to young people's lives. Of course, lunchtime on 1st December will be branded as a Teddy Bears' Picnic!
